There were originally 2 Boy Scout summer camps on the Ranch, Turkey Creek and Tall Chief. Tall Chief was more of a specialty camp dealing with conservation and aquatics. In the late 70's Tall Chief Camp became a Girl Scout Camp. In the early 90's Cub World was opened around Turkey Creek Camp. It was one of the first theme area Cub Scout Camping facilities in the nation. A marina was also added where Scouts and Scouters could learn and experience sailing. And of course there is the Boy Scout camping area where the Troops use for their monthly campout.

John Zink Ranch has been the location for many Council Camporees, Webelos Resident Camps, Order of the Arrow events and district events throughout the years.
