## Fall Fellowship is Here!!

  - Late Fee \$35.00 (if paid after 8/20/2011)
- **BROTHERHOOD CANDIDATES:**
  - Event Fee \$40.00 (if paid 8/14-8/20/2011)
  - Late Fee \$50.00 (if paid after 8/20/2011)

As a special incentive to our Ordeal members who want to seal their Brotherhood, but do not want to spend the weekend, they can register for the **Brotherhood Ceremony Only Fee of just \$20**. This fee does not include any meals, nor does it include a flap. The fee only covers the cost of the sash. To complete the Brotherhood using this option, Ordeal members must be at the camp by 12:30 on Saturday August 27<sup>th</sup>.

All Arrowmen should bring their complete uniform including their sash. As a bonus, on Saturday, August 27<sup>th</sup>, attendees will be able to witness the dedication of all the new projects on the property, including the Mabee Scout Reservation, Siegfried Hall, Poppechan Park, Babbitt Chapel and the Judy Smith Flag Plaza .

# ATTENTION ORDEAL MEMBERS!!!

Information regarding completing your Brotherhood can be found in your OA Handbook and also through the “Jumpstart” link on our website [www.tatsuhwa.org](http://www.tatsuhwa.org).

The official challenges of the Brotherhood are as follows:

**Memorize the signs of Ordeal membership** – the Obligation, official Song, Admonition, the sign of the Ordeal, and the Order of the Arrow handclasp. The obligation and song can be found in your official OA Handbook and membership card. The other three items are not in the OA Handbook, but an experienced Arrowman should be able to help you. The best place to get the information is at your Chapter Meetings each month. There your Chapter Chief and others will be able to help you. Do not worry if you have not fully memorized these items before the event where you will be going for your Brotherhood. You will be able to practice them at the event and during your instruction period that morning.

**Advance in your understanding of the Ordeal.**- Gain a thorough understanding of the Ordeal through which you have passed. This will be covered in the instruction period and you will have an opportunity to attend a Pre-Ordeal ceremony on Friday night at Ordeal weekends. Continue to serve your Unit. Retain your registration in Scouting. During the ten-month period strive to fulfill your Obligation by serving your Unit.

**Plan for service in your Lodge.** - Retain your registration in the Order of the Arrow and your Lodge by keeping your dues paid. Be aware that acceptance of Brotherhood involves a pledge of service to the Lodge. Develop a concrete idea of how you intend to fulfill this pledge.

**Review your progress.**- When you earnestly feel you have met the four challenges above, write a letter to the Lodge Secretary informing him of your desire to seal your membership in the OA by becoming a Brotherhood member. In this letter explain what you think the Obligation means. Describe how you have fulfilled your Obligation to your Unit, your daily life, and how you have used your understanding of the Ordeal to aid in this service. Describe your specific plans for giving service to the Lodge program. **You may take your letter personally to the event** or you may send it to: Ta Tsu Hwa Lodge Secretary, c/o Indian Nations Council, 4295 S. Garnett Rd. Tulsa, OK 74146.

To register for an event return the registration form to the Indian Nations Council Scout Service Center, 4295 S. Garnett Rd. Tulsa, OK 74146 by mail or in person. You can find out more about the Brotherhood and the Order of the Arrow by reading your official OA Handbook. If you have questions, feel free to contact your Chapter Chief, Chapter Adviser, Lodge Officers, Lodge Adviser (all names and phone numbers can be found in the “**Red Bird**”, the official Lodge newsletter, or any experienced Arrowman.

Please note that **the complete 10 months must have passed before the time of your ceremony**. For example, if you went through the Ordeal in September of 2011, you may become a Brotherhood member after July 2012, or if you went through the Ordeal in April 2011, you may become a Brotherhood member after February 2012.

If you meet the requirements for Brotherhood, we urge you to think back on why you first accepted membership into the Order of the Arrow and now make the commitment to seal your membership and pledge yourself to a life of cheerful service to your fellow man.

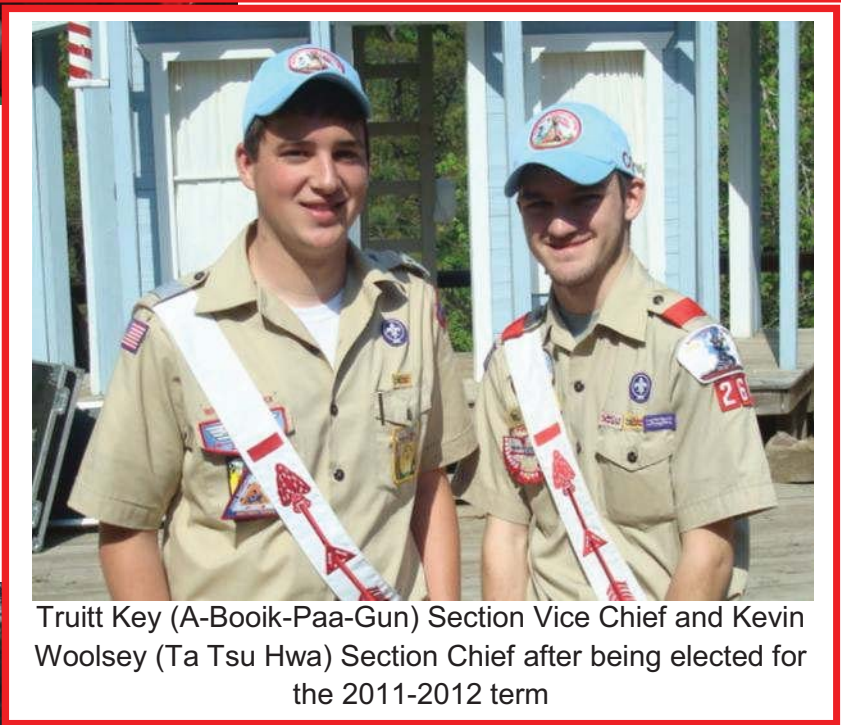

## Fall Ordeal September 30 - October 2

Fall Ordeal will be held from September 30 to October 2, 2011 at Camp Garland. All Ordeal Candidates should plan on attending. This is also another fantastic opportunity for Ordeal members to seal their Brotherhood.

tatsuhwa.org. Remember to register early, because the sooner you register, the lower the cost. Early bird registration ends September 17, 2011..

All Attendees should arrive in Class A uniforms. Ordeal Candidates need to arrive Friday night, September 30. For Friday night, the candidates will need a sleeping bag, a ground cloth, a water bottle, flashlight and work clothes. For Saturday night, they will need standard camping gear, **including a tent.**

The 2012 NOAC will be held from July 30-August 4 at Michigan State University in East Lansing, MI. Watch for details!!!



## Project 2013



National Jamboree 2012 Project 2013 is recruiting 700 Arrowmen to serve on the Order of the Arrow staff at the 2013 National Scout Jamboree at The Summit Bechtel Family National Scout Reserve. Project 2013 will be comprised of three groups including the Jamboree Trek Guides, Day of Service Guides, and the OA Service Corps. All three groups will support a variety of new and traditional activities at the jamboree site. This will be the largest OA Service Corps contingent in history and the Order is looking for the best Arrowmen in the organization to join Project 2013. Plan to attend NOAC 2012 and sign up as a Project 2013 participant. Please note that attendance at NOAC, although preferred, is NOT a prerequisite to be on the Jamboree staff.

The Project 2013 Corps will be structured similar to a lodge with program leadership and chapters. The Project 2013 will be a youth run program at the 2013 National Scout Jamboree led by Order of the Arrow leaders from around the country.

In addition to providing cheerful service, Project 2013 Corps members will be able to participate in evening recreation, visit jamboree program areas, staff the jamboree arena shows, and meet Arrowmen from around the nation.

Since 1950, the Order of the Arrow has been supporting the National Scout Jamborees through the OA Service Corps. The corps is led by youth members of the Order of the Arrow who are responsible for planning and carrying out the responsibilities of the corps at the jamboree. To participate in the Project 2013 Corps, Arrowmen must meet the following requirements:

- Must be 16 years of age, but not older than 20 years of age, by July 15, 2013
- Must be physically fit
- Preference will be given to Arrowmen who will be a Life or Eagle Scout by the start of the Jamboree
- Need approval from their lodge adviser

NOAC Training:

At the 2012 National Order of the Arrow Conference, there will be special half day training for Project 2013 Corps members. This half day event will focus on developing the corps for 2013 and will include special guest speakers. Attendees will receive a special recognition at NOAC. Arrowmen will be able to register for the Project 2013 Corps program at NOAC through the NOAC registration system and will be notified when registration is available



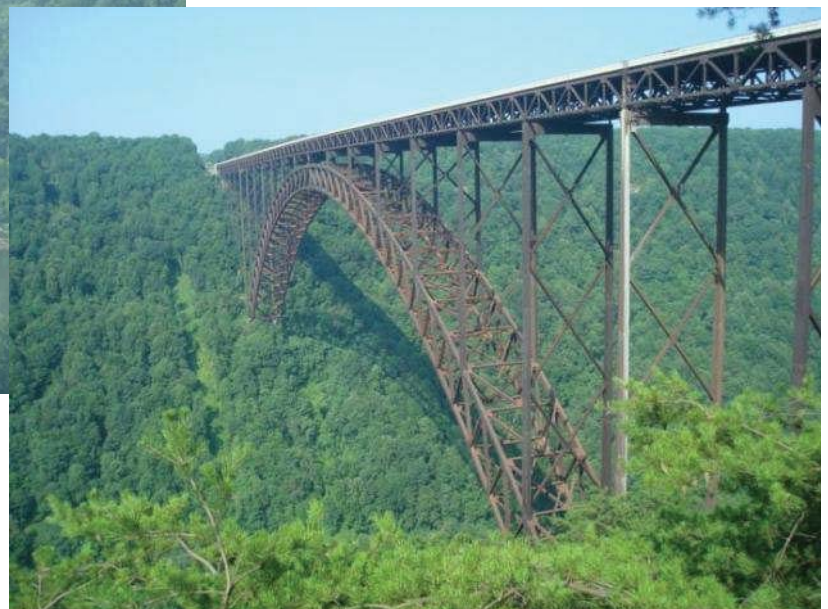
Service and adventure go together like peanut butter and jelly. Milk and cookies.. map and compass. Service and adventure is the idea that the Order of the Arrow explored with SummitCorps The New River Experience in July of 2011 at the New River Gorge National River in West Virginia.

SummitCorps was held for 4 weeks in July. Reminiscent of George Washington and Jefferson National Forest in 2008, SummitCorps allowed Arrowmen to practice the art of balancing conservation and preservation of a great national landmark, the New River Gorge National River in West Virginia. **Ta Tsu Hwa** had two members serve on staff at SummitCorps 2011, outside of Beckley, West Virginia.

The trail built at SummitCorps is officially named the Arrowhead Hike and Bike Trail. The 12.8 mile trail opened on Friday, July 29, 2011.

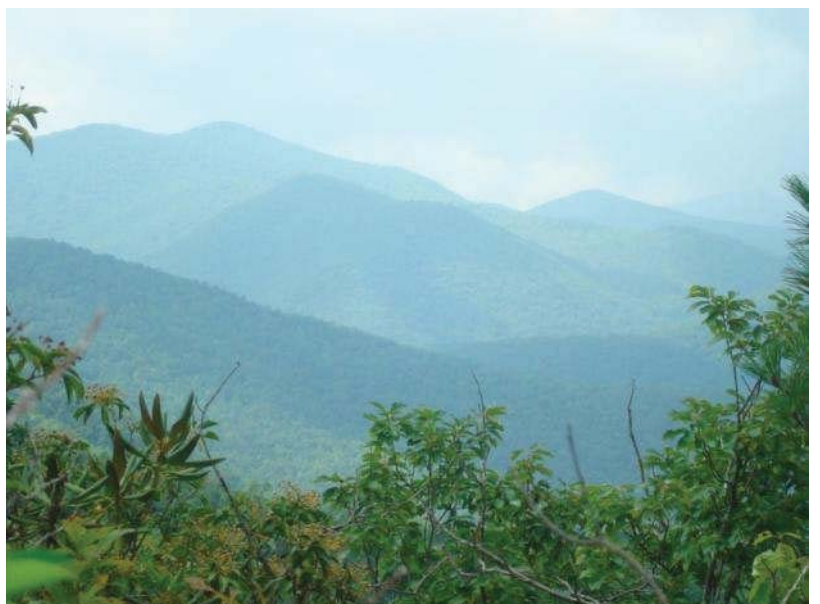

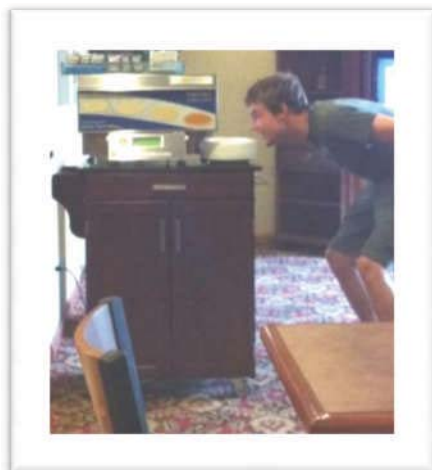
