
Topics might include, managing stress, college applications, and employment as well as OA and scouting related trainings.

Elangomat, the word means friend. The first contact of the new inductees on their journey in the OA is Ordeal. This role, as a new members friend, will define how they see and more importantly experience the OA first hand.

The Elangomat is the reflection of the lodge, the OA, and the obligation. The Elangomat fulfills many different roles during the induction weekend.

They carry out the function of a crew and are a model to the candidates, a guide, a support, a mediator and most important is their intentional development of personal relationship with each member of their crew.
